



ECA Membership Meeting Highlights

The Electrical Contractors' Association of City of Chicago (ECA) is a construction trade association that provides business and labor relations services to nearly 600 electrical contractors in Cook County, Illinois. The Association works with its industry partner, Local Union #134, IBEW to negotiate and administer labor agreements, coordinate apprentice and journeyman level training, as well as promotion of the industry on behalf of these employers. The ECA is also known as the Chicago and Cook County Chapter of the National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA). Currently, 70 signatory firms are members of the Electrical Contractors' Association of City of Chicago (ECA) / Chicago and Cook County Chapter, NECA.

Throughout the year, the ECA holds monthly meetings, excluding the months of July and August, as well as an Annual Spring Conference and a Holiday event. The regular meetings usually feature a guest speaker discussing industry issues. The following highlights a number of recent sessions.

The Electrical Contractors' Association of City of Chicago (ECA) January Regular Membership Meeting was held in conjunction with the Electric Association Annual Conference. The Membership Meeting featured discussions concerning the new installation of the ECA Officers and Executive Committee for 2019, a review of the 2018 Budget and proposed 2019 Budget, Committee Chairman appointments, among other areas. The session was highlighted by a presentation from Mr. Marco Giamberardino, NECA Government Affairs Executive Director. He discussed the elections and the impact on NECA's business / contractor agenda.

The February meeting featured guest speaker Mr. Ryan James Boyle, a Vice President and Senior Economist within the Global Risk Management division of Northern Trust assisted by Mr. Michael Nieves, Northern Trust. Mr. Boyle gave a presentation covering a number of economic forecast topics, including the following: 2019 Economic Forecast for the United States, Chicago outlook, State and political outlook, and an international perspective.

At the March meeting, City of Chicago Department of Buildings (DOB) Commissioner Judy Frydland assisted by Mr. Michael Reynolds, Chief Electrical Inspector, Mr. Grant Ullrich, Deputy Commissioner and Mr. Gregg Cunningham, Department of Buildings staff gave a presentation covering a number of issues affecting electrical construction in Chicago, including the following: 60 tower cranes have been up in the last two years, 48,000 Building Permits were issued in 2017 and 2019 was on pace, the DOB has implemented many reforms and long-term initiatives concerning making the permit process more streamlined, additional Inspectors had been included in the budget for 2019, and a major effort to review and enhance the entire Chicago Building Code would soon be underway.

For the April meeting, Mr. Don Finn, Local Union #134 IBEW Business Manager was the main speaker. Also, Mr. Robert Hattier, Local Union #134 IBEW gave a brief presentation. Each discussed industry concerns, including the following: Mr. Finn and representatives of Local Union #134 IBEW, as well as ECA representative(s) are to work together to gather information concerning worker's needs through work forums and by visiting job sites, the Chicagoland Union Electrical Construction

Industry must continue to promote solar work in the area and throughout the state.

The May meeting had two guest presenters: Mr. David Long, NECA CEO and Dr. Paul Lisnek, WGN-TV Political Analyst. Mr. Long offered comments on his new position and discussed changes that are to be made to better enhance membership benefits. His discussion points regarded the following: as CEO, he will continue efforts concerning market expansion, enhancement of member services, increase viability of NECA membership, as NECA is in the process of restructuring to expand its presence. He also commended the Chicago Chapter and Local 134's Training Program. Dr. Paul Lisnek, WGN-TV Political Analyst offered comments on the national, state and local political landscape.

The Electrical Contractors' Association of City of Chicago (ECA) held its 48th Annual Spring Conference on June 5 - 6, 2019 at the Grand Geneva Resort in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin. Over 80 individuals registered for the event. The golf outing scheduled for Wednesday, June 5, 2019 at the Brute Course was a success, as the weather cooperated with a sunny afternoon. Peer Into Your Peers' Businesses

However, for decades hundreds of electrical contractors have formed "Peer Groups" for that very purpose. Within NECA, many Peer Groups have been formed by members, independently from the Association itself, and they continue to thrive. In more recent years, such groups have been launched and administered by consulting firms (on a fee basis), accounting firms, and even insurance brokers are in the mix of pulling groups together these days.

The typical structure for the groups that NECA members have launched involve meeting to discuss estimating, accounting, marketing, purchasing, tool management, safety, insurance, motivation of personnel, long-range planning, construction claims, change orders, service work, and labor relations. In addition, they often routinely travel as a group to one another's firms to conduct critiques of each other's operations. When Peer Groups are formed, companies are often grouped together within a certain range of annual sales, in order to be more relevant, and are selected to avoid having direct competitors involved. My own positive past experience was with a group that followed the above approach and structure (An Academy White-Paper that I contributed to on this topic is readily available).

Of course, not everyone can fit the commitment of joining a formal Peer Group into an overcrowded schedule. But there are some alternatives. One in particular that I would like to mention is the NECA Network. As a monitored service offered by the Association, the NECA Network hosts an Open Forum on-line. The on-line platform has a variety of communities, but the Open Forum itself has over 23,000 registered users. Users post discussion topics, with over 320 currently listed. The topics are wide ranging, but all of them are pertinent to electrical contractors. You will see people asking questions ranging from software reviews to how to evaluate job performance of their estimators, best practices for daily time cards, service operations, prefab best practices...you get the idea. With so many users on-line, it is always interesting to see the candid and well thought out responses that come in. Much like Peer Groups, this community can be surprisingly open about what has worked in their businesses and what has not. I haven't seen anything quite this targeted or useful on the standard social media sites. The NECA Network doesn't fully substitute for the in-depth interactions of a Peer Group and clearly nothing on-line can match the personal relationships we build. However, this is a great tool for getting quick and useful feedback on a variety of electrical contracting topics. 


